Sean wanted to know if anyone in the jungle still used blowguns. "Some of my Waorani friends still hunt monkeys and birds using a blow gun," Vuwe told him. Waorani put poison from plants (curare) onto the tip of their dart, but some other tribes use venom from poison dart frogs. These frogs are extremely poisonous.
