Keep on Praying

Sean found a praying mantis in the garden.
Praying mantises get their name from the way they hold their front forelegs. They look like they're praying. A mantis's head is shaped like a triangle with a large eye on each side. It is the only insect that can turn it's head 180c (half way around). This and the large eyes mean these insects have excellent sight – even seeing things 35 metres

away. Mantises also have excellent hearing. Good sight and hearing means they are always alert to what's happening around them.
