

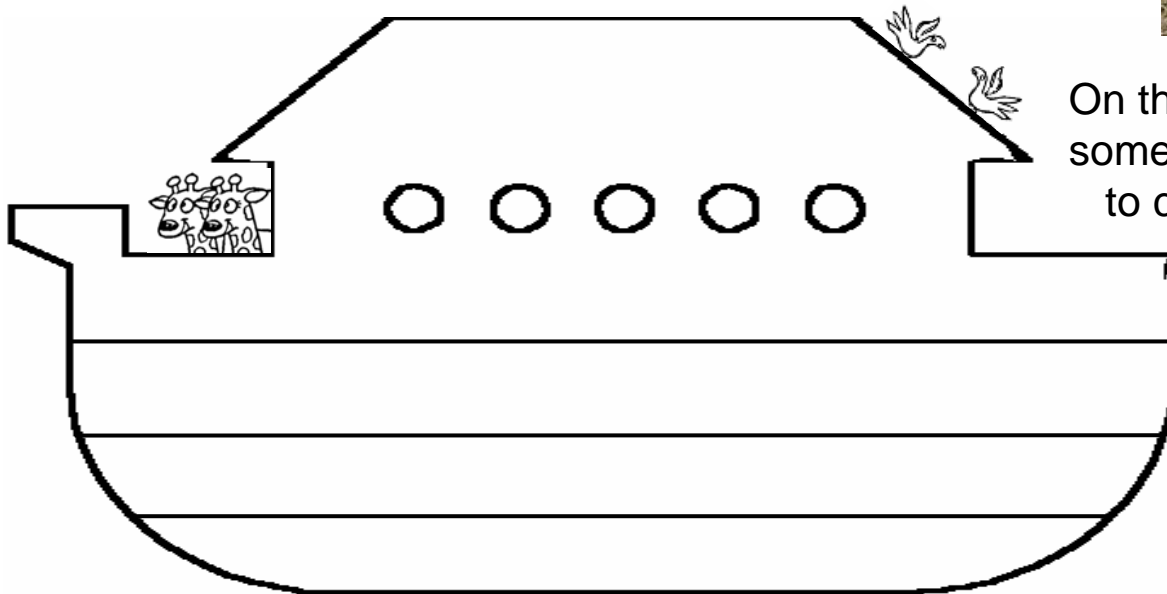


A job well done
